

**GUIDELINES FOR SUBMITTING A PROPOSAL TO THE ALLIANCE FOR A GREEN REVOLUTION IN AFRICA (AGRA)/SEED PRODUCTION FOR AFRICA**

Please submit all materials in English:

**1. COVER LETTER**

This letter must be on letterhead and signed, from the head of the institution, requesting for support of the proposal/project and should include the following details:

- A short (1 paragraph) description of the project.
- The total amount being requested from AGRA.
- Addressed to Program Officer, Seed Production and Dissemination

**2. GRANT PROPOSAL OUTLINE**

##### 1. Introduction

***Your company will only qualify for AGRA support if it is going to:***

(i) Offer product/service that is for a charitable purpose.

***What is a charitable purpose?*** It is a purpose to benefit the poor and to serve a public good. The intension is therefore to enable poor smallholder farmers access improved crop seed varieties, and not to primarily market the institution's products.

(ii) Avail seed at a price lower than what is being offered by other suppliers (companies)

(iii) Avail a more diverse range of crop species (cereals and legumes) and not just maize like most companies

(iv) Enable poor farmers to access seed which they would otherwise never do in the absence of these companies through a good distribution network

(v) Carry out awareness creation activities through demos and field days, and other media, on importance of using improved quality seed.

(vi) Plough back surplus funds into seed production and dissemination to reach more farmers

Other points to note are:

(i) What comparative advantage does your company have over others

(ii) Who are the other players in the seed industry

(iii) The importance of the crops which you want to produce and promote under this project in your country and in people's diet.

(iv) Outline the production constraints affecting the crops you want to produce. What research has been done so far? How can the problems be solved? What gains have been achieved?

### 3. What is the proposal seeking to address

  - To avail good quality seed to poor, smallholder farmers
  - To avail improved seed to poor small-scale farmers at affordable cost and quantities (packages)
  - To create awareness among farmers about the importance of improved varieties and where to get them
  - To establish retail outlets and a team of agro-dealers where farmers can easily access improved and quality seed
- Planned activities (quantify numbers and amounts e.g. indicate the crops to be produced, amounts in tons, number of farmers targeted, which varieties, advantages of those varieties, location where the activities will be carried out, etc). The activities should among others include:
  - Seed production (give details on the crop varieties, quantities, location etc)
  - Educate poor farmers on the improved seed varieties through on-farm demonstrations, field days, agricultural shows, radio programs, seed trade fairs, print materials etc (give details on the numbers for each, how they will be done etc)
  - Make seed available to farmers by packaging in small and affordable quantities (specify size of packs), provide efficient distribution channels by working with agro-dealers (indicate how many, support you will give them and how you will monitor this activity)
- Provide a map of your country to show areas you will be covering in this proposed project
- Expected outputs (specify numbers per output)
- Include a summarized production plan
- Expected outcomes (summarize these in the table format below):
